

Course Criteria for Appalachian Studies Minor or Undergraduate Certificate Courses

Course Type 1:

A. Approximately 30% or more of the course's content is focused on the Appalachian Region (or some part of Appalachia)

OR

B. Approximately 30% or more of the course's content is produced by Appalachian authors, film-makers, artists, etc.

Course Type 2:

- A. Approximately 30% or more of the course is focused on other global regions comparable to Appalachia or issues relevant to Appalachia. Examples include:
 - Other mountainous areas
 - Communities dependent upon natural resource extraction
 - Marginalized, poor, or developing areas
 - Public health, environmental, political, and/or cultural topics relevant to Appalachia

AND

- B. Students are also permitted to focus course paper(s) or project(s) on Appalachia. These may include the following:
 - Research paper
 - Journal
 - Oral presentation
 - Poster
 - Film
 - Multi-media project
 - Portfolio of reflections
 - Service/community engagement activity and paper
 - Any research/reflection assignment that comprises at least 10% of the course grade.
